Learning and Teaching	All Sacred Heart College teaching staff are expected to contribute to the planning, development, implementation and evaluation of the College curriculum, including differentiated curriculum that caters for individual learning needs.

Actively support the Learning Leaders in producing high quality curriculum, reporting and assessment documentation and meeting set deadlines. Attend and positively contribute to Learning Area meetings and engage in learning reflection discussions. Use school data to improve student outcomes through enhanced teacher pedagogy and student engagement. Monitor the progress of each student and provide meaningful and regular feedback to each student on their progress. Understand and adhere to state and national course requirements including the standards of professional practice.
