Year 7 2025 Enrolment Applications

Please find below a short letter we have sent to the newsletters of the six Macedon Ranges Parish Primary Schools.

The partnership between parish primary schools and local Catholic secondary schools such as Sacred Heart College is an important one. We share the same foundations in faith and recognise parents as first educators of children.

I am writing today as you make the fundamentally important decision of which secondary school is right for your child. I am aware that there are local independent schools that are asking for early enrolment commitments

to guarantee places at Year 7. Given that, it is important to note that the criteria for enrolment at Sacred Heart College (and all Catholic secondary schools in the Melbourne Archdiocese) gives priority to students who are enrolled in a parish primary school. Students who have received the sacraments have a higher priority, but we expect all students who submit an enrolment application by the closing date **(Friday 28 July 2023)**, and are enrolled at a parish primary school, will be offered a place for Year 7 2025.

Child Safe Week

Last week, Sacred Heart College held Child Safety Week. Having this designated week each year provides the opportunity for students, staff and parents to be updated with the current status of Child Safety. Our Victorian Child Safe program has now become part of the national program, Child Safety, and as such has expanded to include more standards and an evolution of focus. In the original Child Safe, compliance was the major priority, however, the second incarnation focuses on building a safe and supportive school culture.

All of our students were sent the Child Safety update as a presentation, which they worked through in class with their Homeroom Teacher, and at the end they acknowledged that they have heard this important information. Their presentation focused on their right to be safe, at school, at home and in the community, and who they can go to or how they can report if abuse is happening to them or someone they know. Staff participated in their update, where a workshop identifying current practices that come under Child Safety were happening already in the College, as well as brainstorming future ideas and directions we can possibly work on. These ideas will form the basis of our future work around Child Safety.

A presentation on Child Safety updates has now been sent to all parents who have access through PAM. Please take the time to familiarise yourself with the changes that have taken place and click on the acknowledgement that says you have received this information. This along with the student and staff information, forms part of our ongoing development of Child Safety awareness through our College Community.

Introduction to the artwork: 'Mercy' by Aimee McCartney

(Taungurung, Wotjobaluk, Wemba Wemba and Boon Wurrung)

It is a pleasure to introduce our new College artwork. The painting, simply titled 'Mercy', is the work of artist Aimee McCartney, a proud Taungurung, Wotjobaluk, Wemba Wemba & Boon Wurrung woman who lives and works on Gunaikurnai Country.

Aimee's painting offers a representation of Sacred Heart College embedded within the surrounding country. It is a piece that speaks to us about the enormity of time, and how the landscape itself breathes into life stories of the past, and stories of the future. As well as being a remarkable work in its own right, this painting will also form the basis of some new signage for Quambi, which is due for completion later this year.

A major focal point of the artwork are the waterways of the Campaspe River and Post Office Creek. Together with the surrounding waterholes, these nourish and sustain the life and spirit of the land, and the communities that gather on it.

Framing the image are the mountain ranges for which our region is well known. The mountains, or "Ngarraks" in the Taungurung language, are a source of knowledge, history and truth. Their contour lines denote layers of wisdom over time past, and into time future.

There is much to say about this rich, vibrant and deeply spiritual work of art, and we expect that it will serve as an ongoing source of conversation and inspiration for our community.





Thinking about 2024 already!

SHCK has recently welcomed a new Year 12 student for 5 weeks. Louis is joining us from our sister school Notre Dame du Roc, and is the son of Emmanuel, the French teacher who has been organising the exchange for 10 years. Here is a little introduction Louis has written, in both French and English.

Bonjour, je m'appelle Louis Thielin, j'ai 17ans et 18 le 29 septembre. Je suis français et j'ai étudié au lycée Notre Dame du Roc à La Roche Sur Yon. J'habite en Vendée, un département qui est situé dans la partie Ouest de la France, près de Nantes et La Rochelle. J'ai une sœur qui s'appelle Alice et qui a 20 ans et un frère, Antoine qui a 23 ans. Ils sont tous les deux venus en Australie, comme mon père qui s'appelle Emmanuel et qui viens tous les 2 ans. En France, j'aime faire du sport comme le tennis, la course à pied et le judo. J'ai aussi la chance d'habiter près de la mer ce qui me permet de pratiquer des sports nautiques comme le surf avec mes amis. De

I live in Vendee, a department located in the western part of France, near Nantes and La Rochelle. I have a sister, Alice who is 20 years old, and one brother, Antoine who is 23 years old. They both came to Australia a few years ago, like my dad, Emmanuel, who comes every 2 years. In France I love practicing in sport like tennis, running and judo. I am also lucky to live close to the beach, which allows me to do water sport like surfing with my friends. Moreover, I love meeting my friends and enjoy spending time with them. Next year, I will study economics, to apply for business school later on. For that I need a very good level of English, and it's for this reason that I am spending a month here. I arrived Sunday 9th at 6pm after 20 hours on the plane. Since my arrival, I have enjoyed the beautiful landscapes of this country, and I also got to see kangaroos.

NEWS FROM JARLMADANGAH 2023 - Rose Sud Year 11

The Jarlmadangah 2023 trip was an experience we will never forget. The immersion into an Indigenous community was eye-opening. We learned so much about ourselves, our group and about Aboriginal culture.

We started our twelve-day trip in Broome. We enjoyed watching a beautiful sunset at Cable Beach. The next day, we visited the Sisters of St John of God Museum where we learned about the history of education in the Western Australia Aboriginal communities through the help of the Irish nuns and German brothers. Although we heard about the tragic stories of the past, we learned how the nuns improved the lives of those living in leprosy camps and orphanages. We discovered that the museum plays an important part in assisting people of the Stolen Generations to locate their families through the photos collected by the museum.

We then travelled by 4WD to Lombadina where we were able to experience life in an Aboriginal community. Lombadina was a different experience to Jarlmadangah because we were just visitors. In Jarlmadangah we were part of the community. Our experience at Lombadina was beneficial because it gave us an insight into what different communities are like. While we were there we also explored Beagle Bay with its beautiful church with the pearl shell decorations. After our stay at Lombadina, we started the drive to Derby. When we arrived we visited the prison boab, which has great importance to the communities of the area. After spending a night there, we were all excited as we were finally heading to Jarlmadangah. On the way, we were fortunate enough to explore Tunnel Creek where we saw a beautiful cave which was part of an ocean reef system.

Once we finally arrived in Jarlmadangah we were greeted by the Principal, Miss Wiki. We experienced a warm welcome from the community which included hugs for all of us from Miss Wiki. We stayed in Jarlmadangah for five days and enjoyed teaching the children the lessons we had prepared, and creating individual connections with each of them. We were fortunate to be taken out to country many times and spent more time with the children and community members who shared their stories and wisdom of the land, and broadened our understanding of their culture. Many tears were shed when we left Jarlmadangah and drove back to Broome. We ended our trip with camel rides at sunset on Cable Beach.

This incredible experience would not have been possible without the hard work of our teachers Mr Webb and Ms Tanner. We would like to thank them for looking after us and for organising the trip. We have all come away with a deeper understanding of the Nyikina Mangala Community in Jarlmadangah. They shared so much about their culture and connection to the land with us. We are all extremely grateful to have had this invaluable experience. It has changed our lives and broadened our understanding of Aboriginal culture in Australia.

Universities / TAFE and questions to ask.

This is a great resource for students interested in transitioning to higher education (Uni/TAFE). We highly encourage visiting to assist with making informed choices about study options after Year 12.

At open days you get to:

- Explore campuses and facilities. Get a feel for higher education.
- Speak with current students / lecturers about specific study areas, what
- certain courses are like & what is required to get into them.

Things to think about at Open Days:

- If you have to move away from home, where are you going to live?
- Will you be happier studying in a large city institution, or a smaller / rural institution?
- Are any specific pre-requisites required? Are there any scholarships I can apply for? How strong are the links with industry?
- What employment options are there once the course is completed?

On arrival get a map and visit relevant faculties or schools:
