
Prayer

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE - Dr Darren Egberts

This week's prayer was written by the foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, Catherine McAuley and is regarded amongst her most personal reflections. This week, I have been attending the Australasian Mercy Secondary Schools Association (AMSSA) conference hosted by All Hallows College in Brisbane. The conference explored the theme, Mercy in liminal times" and alongside four other Sacred Heart College leaders, have enjoyed a variety of engaging and challenging keynote speakers, workshops, liturgies and a conference mass.

The conference theme recognises that schools in the Mercy tradition across Australia are in uncertain times after several years of the Covid pandemic as well as difficult economic times challenging our mission and message. The young people that we seek to educate and grow are subject to increasingly mixed messages from media especially in the online world with traditional sources of authority and truth discredited in their minds.

The challenge of living in uncertain times was explored by the conference's opening keynote speaker,

Sr Berneice Loch RSM, the first leader of the Institute of Sisters of Mercy of Australia and Papua New Guinea (ISMAPNG). Sr Berneice compared the situation of Catherine McAuley in the early 1800's with contemporary times. She identified the challenges and complexities Catherine experienced as a Catholic woman determined to establish a House of Mercy that would serve the poor women and children of Dublin. Sr Berneice encouraged Mercy schools and their leadership to be open to vulnerability and the times of 'unableness' as the real opportunities to allow the Holy Spirit to guide our mission.

It is a prospect that fills many Sacred Heart College households with excitement and anticipation. Lunchtime activities included: a hip hop workshop, where students had the opportunity to learn some great techniques from some expert dancers; a lunchtime performance given by talented ex Sacred Heart student, and well-known musician and songwriter, Taylor Sheridan; fabulous badge-making; music in the courtyard on arrival at school, and a staff meeting where staff wellbeing was checked in on. Information pamphlets from Beyond Blue and Head Space on managing different Mental Health conditions were made available in different areas around the College. The week concluded with a delicious and well received Healthy Breakfast for the whole school, organised by our Health Centre Coordinator and Hospitality staff and students.











MERCY DAY

This week the PAM permission and Colour Run Fact Sheet will have been sent home. Please take the time to read the information about the day, and make sure you give permission to participate if your child wishes to. The coupon envelopes have been handed out in Homeroom so if you have not as yet seen this, please check school bags or ask of its whereabouts. Students can only purchase a maximum of \$10 worth, with more available to top up on the day if needed. This is important, as excess coupons cannot be redeemed. All money for coupons goes towards Mercy Works, the charity arm of the Mercy Sisters. A guest speaker addressing the students at the beginning of the day will outline where the money collected will be going.

Mercy Day is an important part of being a Mercy school, and commemorates the opening by Catherine McAuley of her Baggot Street residence as a place for educating homeless girls. We celebrate this with a community building day, with many activities and fun events happening. All purchases and entries to competitions and activities happen through coupons. A free BBQ lunch will be provided for all students. The Colour Run is a fun filled activity that requires the wearing of old lightly coloured clothes to get the full effect, and costs \$5 entry. Permission must be given through PAM for students to be able to participate.

The Commonwealth Bank is advising schools that a new scam is doing the rounds in Victoria. Scammers are impersonating Catholic and Independent school debt collectors and offering steep school fee discounts to take payment directly via Credit Card.








JARLMADANGAH NEWS - Brett Gardner


NEWS FROM OUTDOOR AND ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES - April Cincotta

MEDICATION AND CAMPS

To ensure safe administration and storage of medications, any student requiring medication while on camp must hand their medication to their homeroom teacher the first

morning of camp. <u>All</u> medication needs to be clearly labelled with the student's name and in its original packaging. <u>All</u> medication needs to be accompanied by a completed Medical Authority Form. INFLUENZA (Flu)

We have a confirmed case of Influenza B (flu) within the College. The flu is a contagious viral infection that can cause severe illness and life-threatening complications, including pneumonia. The flu is spread by contact with fluids from coughs and sneezes.

The common symptoms of the flu are fever, a dry cough, body aches, feeling extremely weak and tired, sore throat and a runny or stuffy nose. A fact sheet on the flu can be found at http://www.betterhealth.vic.gov.au/health/conditionsandtreatments/flu-influenza, please take the time to read it so you become familiar with the virus, in particular its signs and symptoms.

As the flu is highly contagious and since there have been several cases reported in our local community, the College is taking every precaution to prevent further spread of the infection. If your child is unwell and or showing flu like symptoms, please don't send them to school. If your child is displaying flu like symptoms while at school, they will be isolated and parents/emergency contacts will be called to collect them. The Public Health and Wellbeing Regulations state that students are to be excluded from school until they are well. 


